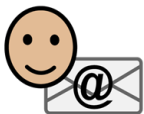
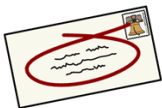

## Western Bay Integrated Autism Service



The Integrated Autism Service (IAS) is a service to support autistic adults and the parents/carers of autistic children, young people and adults in Western Bay. Western Bay includes Swansea, Neath Port Talbot and Bridgend.

Adults, parents/carers and professionals will be able to refer in to the Integrated Autism Service.



## Integrated Autism Service

Advice and support for the parent/carer of autistic **children and young people**.



The IAS could support with

- sleep problems
- issues with eating
- challenging behaviour
- anxiety
- developing social skills

In addition to the above, **adults** may also access:

- diagnostic assessment for those who think they may have Autism
- support to access other services which could include employment, education, health, leisure and recreational activities



## Integrated Autism Service

Support may include:

- empowering individuals, families/carers to manage the difficulties they are facing
- providing advice and signposting for individuals, families/carers and services
- short blocks of direct support
- liaising with other services, including, GP, colleges, employers and leisure services.



The service **will not** provide the following:

- emergency or crisis intervention
- respite care
- rapid response
- diagnostic assessments for people under 17½ years
- prescription or monitoring medication



**Other services are available to help with these issues.**

**The IAS is unable to provide direct support to adults already in receipt of care and support from statutory services e.g Mental Health, Learning Disability and Social Services. We will support the *professionals* working in these areas.**
